The Area 26 Preamble

Service to the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous shall be the primary purpose of General Service in Area 26. In all our proceedings we shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Twelve Traditions, the Twelve Concepts, and the Warranties as outlined in the "The A.A. Service Manual". In the absence of specific indications in these Guidelines or of direct Assembly action, the latest edition of "The A.A. Service Manual" may be relied upon.

For clarification of Area 26 Committee financial responsibilities, the current Financial Guidelines should be adhered to.

Is your group connected to A.A. as a whole?

- * Area 26 is one of 93 Service Areas in the U.S. and Canada which come together for an annual conference.
- * The General Service Conference (GSC) process goes on all year, through the work of the General Service Structure. This is the group conscience of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- * Area 26 meets four times each year. In October, we hold our Area Assembly. Every two years, we elect an Area Delegate to serve at GSC.
- * Area 26 serves over 700 groups
- * Area 26 is made up of 37 Districts. (36 geographical districts and 1 Linguistic District (Spanish speaking groups).
- * Geographically, Area 26 serves Kentucky, and portions of southern Indiana, Ohio, Illinois and Tennessee.

Area 26 Standing Committees

The primary purpose of all of our service committees is to carry the message of Alcoholics Anonymous. Specifically,

Archives is the means by which we collect, preserve, and share the rich and meaningful heritage of our Fellowship.

Cooperation With the Professional Community (CPC) provides information about A.A. to those who have contact with alcoholics through their profession.

Corrections works with individual members and groups interested in carrying our message behind the walls and smooth the way from the facility to the A.A. community through pre-release contacts.

Grapevine provides information to the Fellowship regarding A.A. Grapevine and La Viña publications

Kentuckiana News publishes the Area's quarterly newsletter.

Literature informs the Fellowship of available literature and works to ensure the integrity of our message through literature.

Public Information conveys information to the general public, including the media.

Registrar maintains the records/contact information for all Groups and Districts within the Area.

Special Needs/Accessibilities works to provide assistance to those that need special help to receive the A.A. message.

Treatment works with individual members and groups interested in carrying our message into treatment facilities and to set up a means of "bridging the gap" from the facility to an A.A. group in the individual's community.

Website maintains the Area 26 website.

Our Standing Committees meet on Saturday mornings at 10:30 a.m. during our Area Quarterly Meetings. Come join us!
